Probation

Undergraduate Students

The School of Education has a cumulative GPA requirement of 2.5 to meet advanced standing requirements. Student teaching requires a cumulative GPA of 2.5 *and* a 2.75 in your major courses. If your cumulative GPA falls below a 2.5 for three consecutive quarters, you will be dismissed from the School of Education.

Master's Students

Master's students who are fully accepted into the program will be placed on probation if their grade point average falls below 3.0. Students will remain on probation until four additional courses are taken at which time a new evaluation is done. If the grade point average is not raised students may be subject to dismissal from the School of Education.

Doctoral Students

Doctoral students who are fully accepted into the program will be placed on probation if their grade point average falls below 3.0 prior to the completion of 36 credit hours and 3.3 after the completion of 36 credit hours. Students will remain on probation until four additional courses are taken at which time a new evaluation is done. If the grade point average is not raised students may be subject to dismissal from the School of Education.
