is one of America's leading public intellectuals and "The Ethicist" for *The New York Times Magazine*. He is a philosopher, cultural theorist, and scholar of African and African-American studies. The author of such titles as *Cosmopolitanism*, *The Honor Code*, and *Lines of Descent: W.E.B. DuBois and the Emergence of Identity*, Appiah was named one of Foreign Policy's Top 100 Global Thinkers and awarded the National Humanities Medal by the White House in 2012. He has taught at Yale, Cornell, Duke, Harvard, and Princeton, among other schools, and currently teaches philosophy and law at New York University.
