Dr. Amy Clark's Cultural Relevance and Linguistic Flexibility in Literature Discussions with Emergent Bilingual Children was accepted by the Bilingual Research Journal.

"They Almost Become the Teacher": Pre-K to Third Grade Teachers' Experiences Reading and Discussing Culturally Relevant Texts with Their Students was published in Reading Horizons in December. Dr. Clark was the first of two authors.

As part of a grant award from the Barat Education Foundation and the Library of Congress, Dr. Kiel launched a three course Civics and Primary Source Teaching Micro-credential program.. Teachers and leaders from across the nation are taking part in the micro-credential program sponsored by the grant from the LOC.

#### **Sung Park-Johnson** Associate Professor

Dr. Park-Johnson's article, Teachers' Attitudes and Beliefs About Code-Mixing by Bilingual Students, was published in Educational Studies.

Dr. Park-Johnson presented her

research entitled 'Code-Switching by Young Korean Heritage Speakers: Evidence of Low Heritage Language Proficiency?' at the National Heritage Language Resource Center's Eleventh Heritage Language Research Institute in Albuquerque, New Mexico in June 2019.

She also presented her talk entitled Early Heritage and Second Language Learning in an Immersion Preschool Context at the International Symposium on Bilingualism in Edmonton, Canada in June 2019 and presented her research entitled 'Language Development and Choice by Emergent Bilinguals in Immersion Preschool Setting' at the International Symposium of Monolingual and Bilingual Speech in Chania, Greece in August 2019.
