Course Transfer

The course that you want to transfer was not used to fulfill the requirements of an earned bachelor's or master's degree. Credit earned from a previous degree cannot be used as transfer credit.

Course Substitution

Graduate Students

• You have taken a course that is not listed as a learning domain course and would like the course to fulfill a learning domain requirement.
